Defendant Sentenced to Maximum Sentence for Northgate Stabbing June 2, 2021

Bryan, TX – On Tuesday afternoon, Kevin Ramos, 22, of Navasota, Texas was sentenced to 20 years in prison for Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon and 25 years for Aggravated Robbery with a Deadly Weapon, for an assault at Northgate in 2019.

On January 20, 2019, College Station Police Department responded to the Northgate Bar District after reports of a stabbing.

Around 3:30am, two men were at the ATM at the intersection of Church Street and College Main, depositing tips from the night. While the first man was depositing his cash, and the second man waiting for the machine, the defendant appeared running down College Main with his hands behind his back concealing a knife. The defendant slowed to a walk as he approached, sneaking up on the two men. Without any provocation he attacked the man who was waiting for the ATM, repeatedly stabbing him in the head and neck. The man was able to separate himself from the defendant and yell for help.

At this point, the defendant turned to the man at the ATM machine. Ramos pointed his knife at this man and demanded his money. When the second victim put his hands in the air, Ramos snatched his cash and ran back down College Main, in the direction he came from. At this point the second man began to render aid to the stabbing victim, who was later treated at St. Joseph's Medical Center.

The Police were able to identify Ramos from surveillance footage in the area. The defendant later confessed to the crime and plead guilty to the Honorable Judge John Brick despite claiming to have no actual memory of the attack.

This case was investigated by the College Station Police Department and prosecuted by Kristin Burns and Ashley Martin.
