Domestic Violence Abuser Receives 18 Years for Burglary and Assault

Bryan, TX – On Wednesday, April 27, 2016, Logan McMann was sentenced to 18 years in prison for assaulting his girlfriend and breaking into a neighbor's home to assault his girlfriend.

McMann's convictions stemmed from an argument between McMann and the victim of the assault, his then-girlfriend. When the argument turned physical, the victim tried to escape from their home. McMann continued assaulting her during the escape attempt and threw a stone through the driver's side window of her car. The victim ran to a neighbor's home to seek help, with McMann pursuing her.

The neighbors allowed the victim to seek shelter in their home. McMann continued to try and get to his girlfriend by breaking through the French doors on the back patio of the neighbors' home. Once inside, he fought the one of the homeowners as he searched for his girlfriend.

The male homeowner was eventually able to wrestle McMann back outside, but only after McMann grabbed a piece of broken glass and threatened the male homeowner with bodily injury.

Brazos County Sheriff's deputies arrived shortly after McMann was forced outside and he was arrested. He then threatened to come back and kill everyone at the house.

McMann will have to serve one-half of his sentence before becoming eligible for parole.

McMann was also sentenced to 10 years in prison for assaulting his girlfriend and 10 years in prison for his threats to retaliate against the neighbors.

The impact of domestic violence goes far beyond just the victim. Those willing to use violence against their partners and anyone who shelters them have no place in our community. —John Brick, Assistant District Attorney
