40 Years in Prison for Fourth DWI

Bryan, TX - On Thursday, May 19th, a Brazos County jury found Shane Terrell guilty of DWI 3rd or More. This was in fact Mr. Terrell's fourth conviction for endangering lives on Texas roadways while intoxicated.

At 2 o'clock on Friday afternoon, April 4, 2014, Mr. Terrell was north bound as he exited Highway 6 and then ran the red light at the intersection of Texas Avenue and Deacon Drive in College Station. His SUV slammed into a car in the intersection and then flipped over on top of another car, before flipping several more times and coming to rest on the property of Wings and More restaurant.

Fortunately no other drivers were seriously injured, but blood results showed that Mr. Terrell was over the legal limit at the time of the collision.

Mr. Terrell was on parole for a previous DWI in Hamilton County at the time of the offense and had previously been to prison for retaliation. After the jury found him guilty, Mr. Terrell agreed to 40 years in prison.
