Defendant Sentenced to 25 Years in Prison for Aggravated Robbery July 15, 2019

Bryan, TX – Monday, July 15th, Quenderrius Jackson was sentenced to 25 years in prison for an aggravated robbery that took place in March 2018. Jackson was also sentenced to 20 years in prison for aggravated kidnapping arising out of the same incident. The defendant pled guilty to both charges and elected to have Judge Bryan assess the sentence.

During the early morning hours of March 18, 2018, a College Station resident drove to his home. While he was still inside his car in the driveway, Jackson got into the car, pointed a gun at the owner, and forced him into the backseat of the vehicle. Two other men got into the car as well and they began driving. The men took the victim's phone and wallet and forced him to put a sweater over his head and face so he would not be able to see the defendants' identity or the location where he was being taken. The men eventually drove to Hearne where they stopped at a bank and attempted to use the victim's cards at an ATM. After they were unsuccessful, they drove the victim to an abandoned property outside of Hearne and let him out of the car. They then drove away in the stolen car. Eventually, the victim was able to walk to a home and the resident called 911 for him to report the crime.

Investigators located the men through surveillance footage of them using the victim's credit card at two Brazos County businesses later that same day. Both co-defendants were charged as well and are scheduled for trial this fall. The case was investigated by officers and detectives from the College Station Police Department and the Brazos County District Attorney's Office.

The case was prosecuted by Brazos County Assistant District Attorneys Natalie Tise and Ashley Martin.
